Mission statement

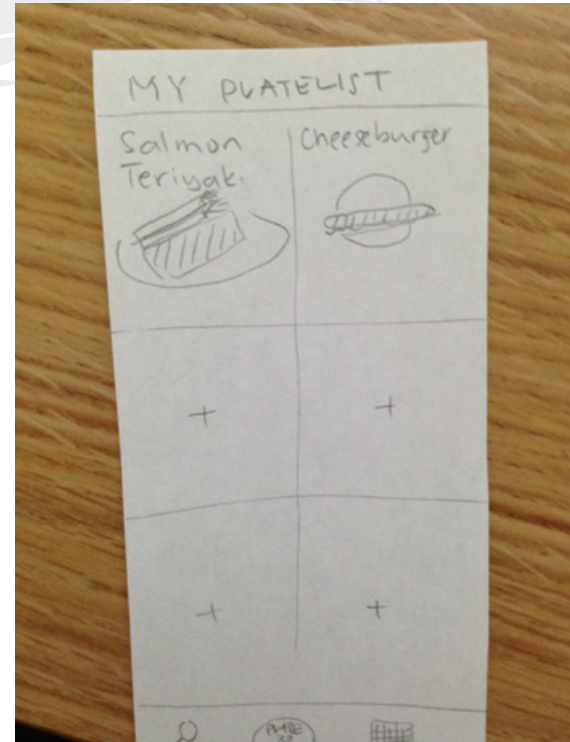
Our goal is to **motivate people to cook for themselves** by removing

- barriers to cooking.

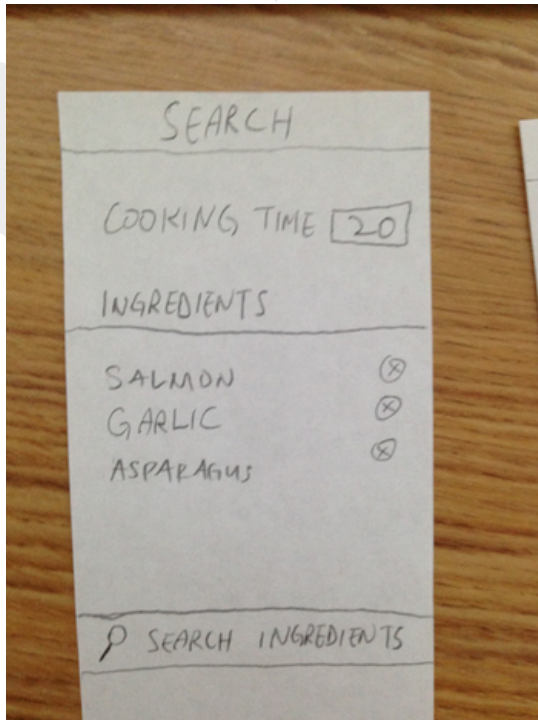
Simple task

Moderate task



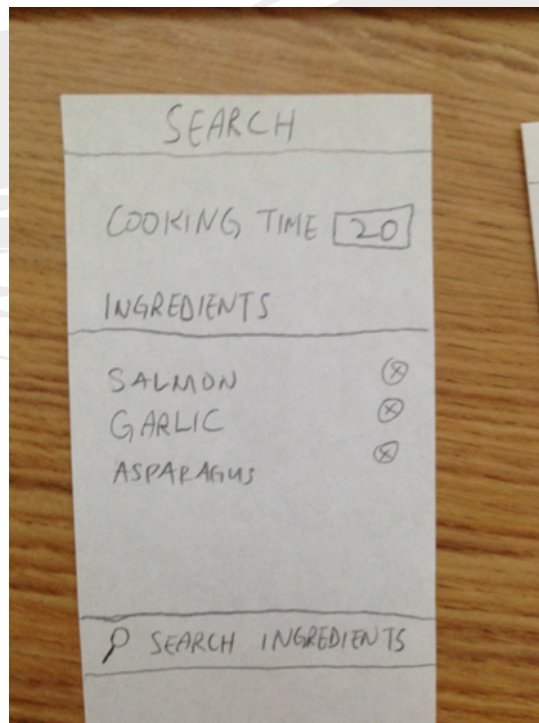
Searching for food

3 scenarios

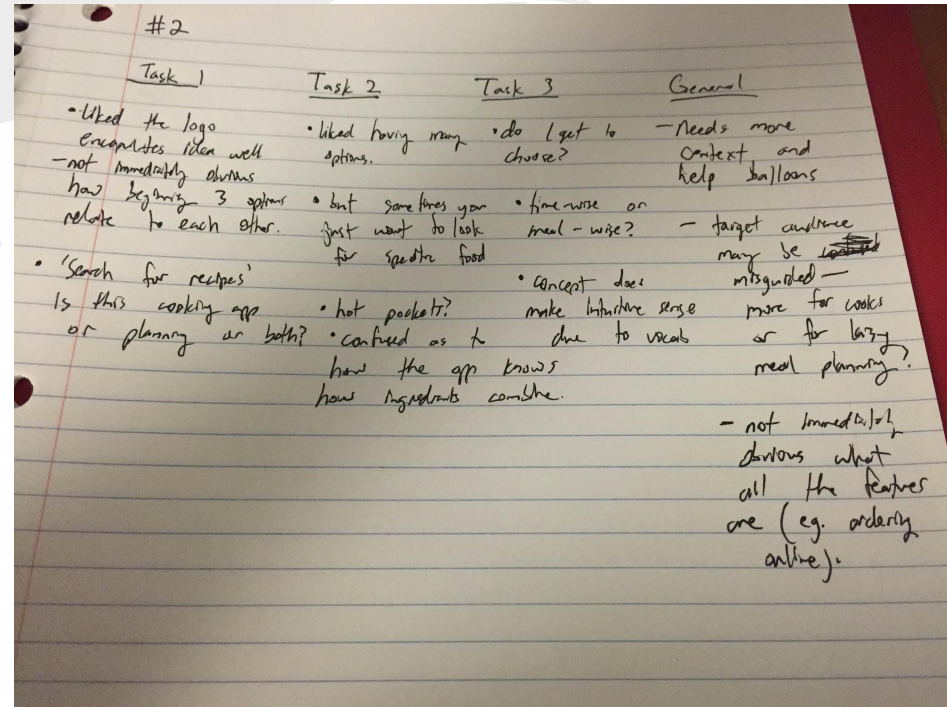


Experimental method
