- She is content with her current job as a physician, although it is harder than she had expected.
- **Regarding pursuing a career... “talk to people who have been doing their job for a while as well as new hires. The beginning and end of careers are very different in terms of lifestyles, families, etc.”**

## Additional Needfinding POV (1)



Tiffany S.

- We met Tiffany, a 35-year-old physician who attended UCLA (undergrad and med school).
- We were amazed to learn that although she recommends talking with a variety of people in a field of interest, she also believes mentoring will only take one so far without personal experience.
- It would be game changing to have mentoring be something that helps people gain personal experience.

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## Additional Needfinding POV (2)



Jess S.

- We met Jess, who is a 28-year-old director of worship and creative arts for a church ministry next to Palo Alto High School.
- We were amazed to learn that even at her age and position, Jess feels unsure about reaching out to mentors or being a mentor herself.
- It would be game changing to be able to comfortably connect Jess with a mentor who also worked in her career field.

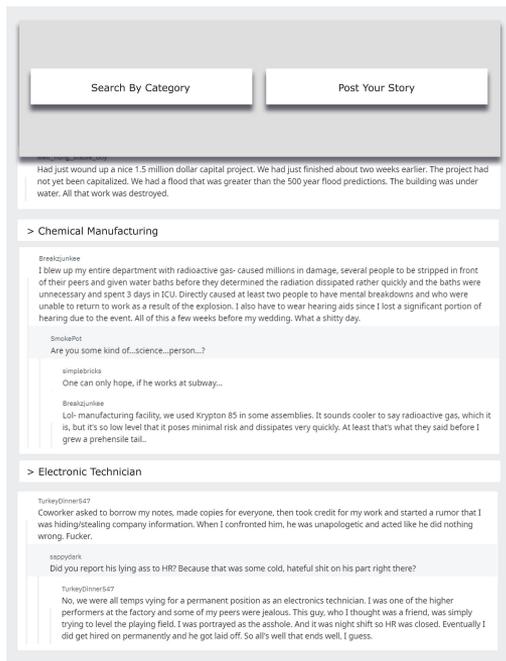

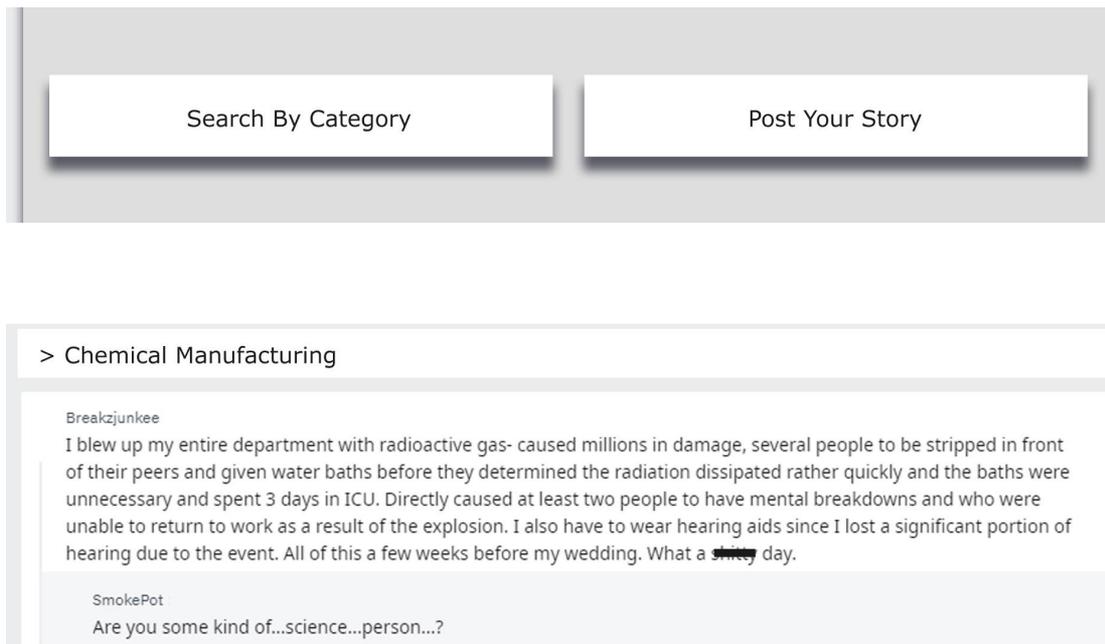
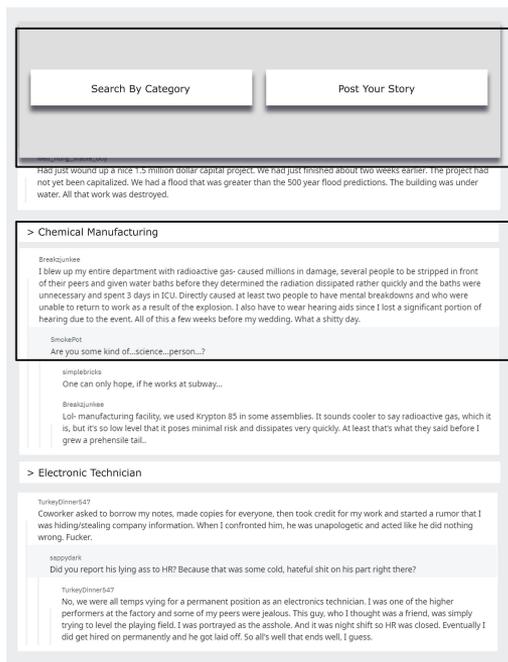

- Result: Tests the assumption that people gain insight from listening to other people’s negative stories. ---VALID---

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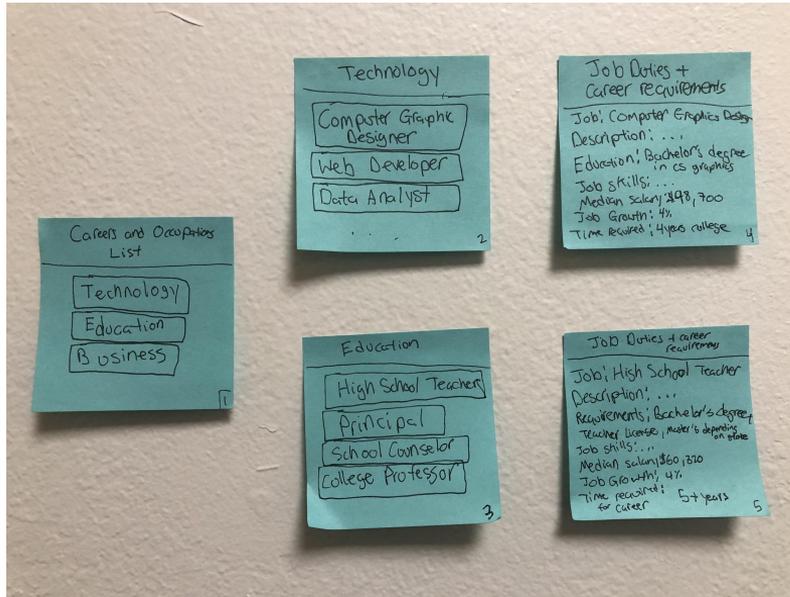

- Jane found layout to be serviceable but desired more information.
- Result : Tests the assumption that people will make choices about careers based on how long it takes and how many resources they must use to obtain that career. --INVALID---

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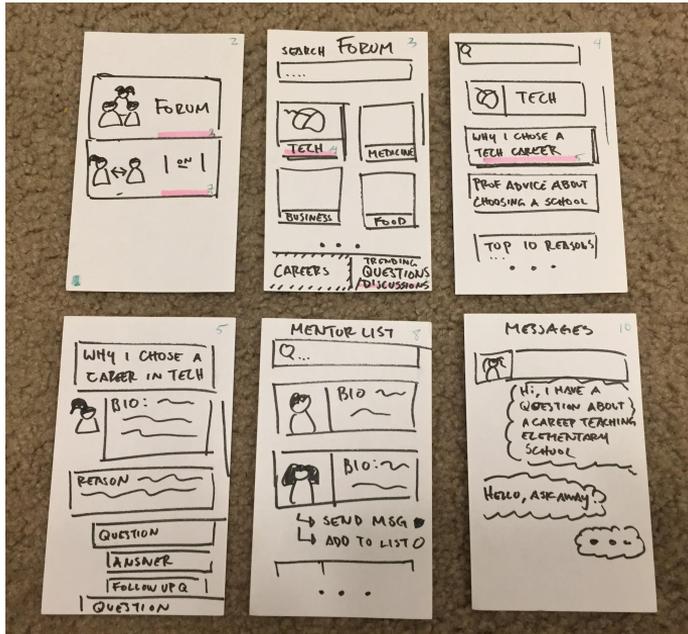

- “Honestly, the idea is awesome! I’d totally use it.”

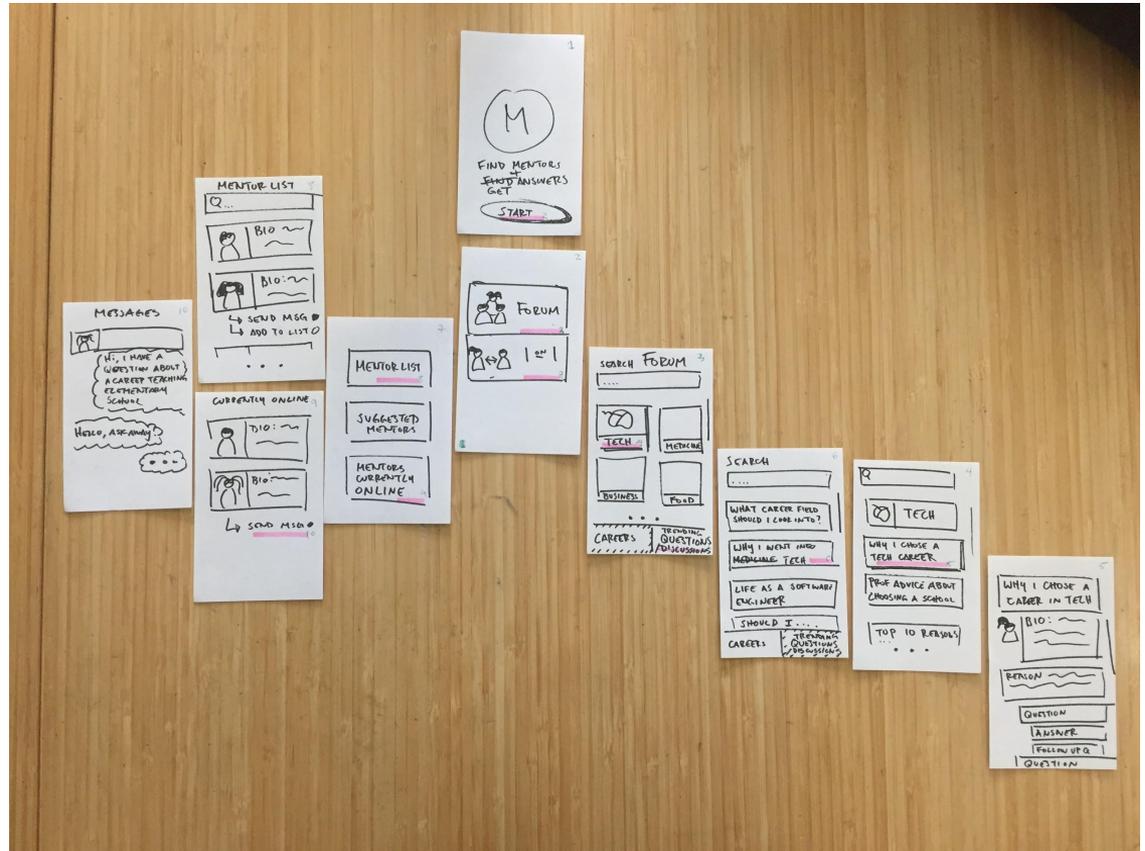


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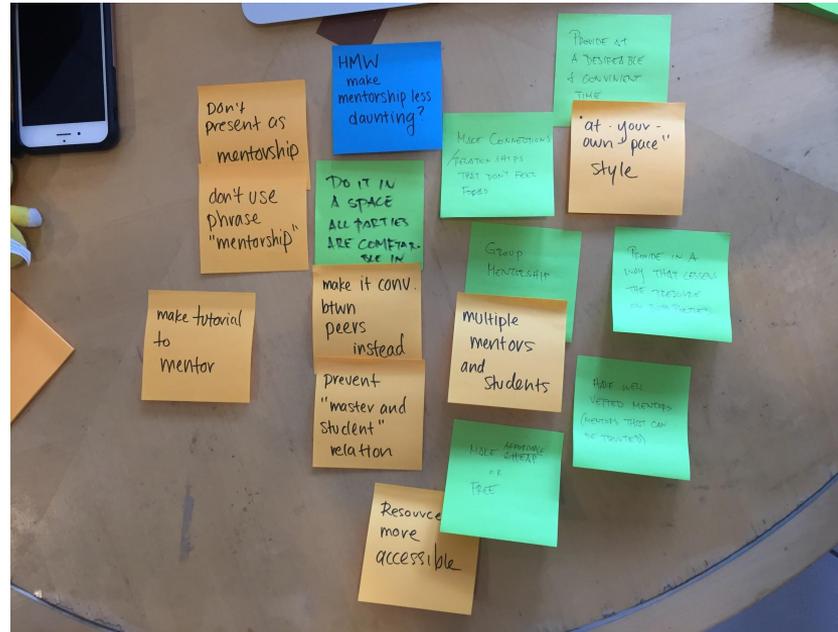

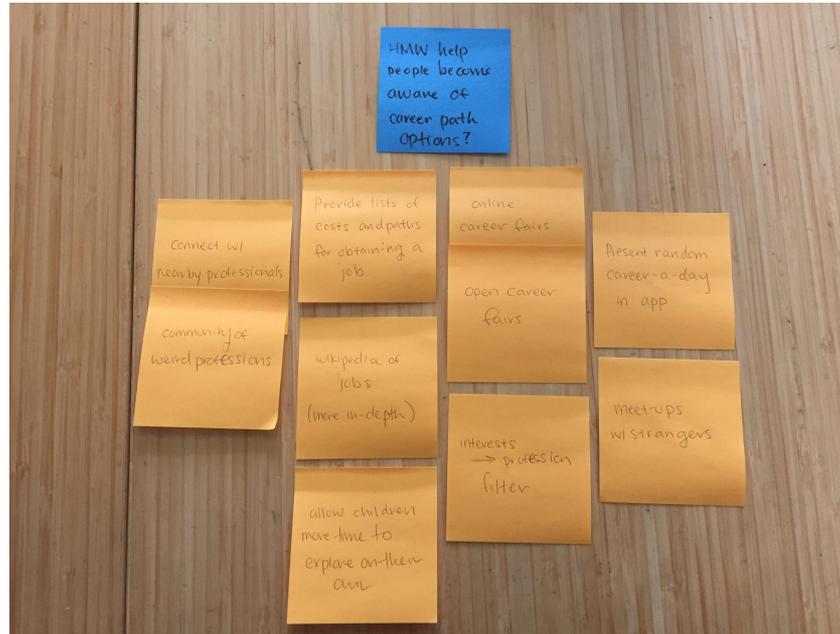
